A teaching assistant for the course **F1HH 4520 - Gender in Emergencies: Rapid Gender Analysis** taught by **Isadora QUAY** on **MON 2:45-4:45pm from January 28 to May 2. 16 hours paid for the mission of the teaching assistant + separate payment for the grading** (see below).

Course description:

During a humanitarian emergency, everyone is affected but people of all gender and ages are affected differently. Rapid Gender Analysis is how the humanitarian community prepares gender analysis during an emergency response. It is a principled based course using realistic time-bound practice to complete assignments. This course is the graduate student version of the same course taught to humanitarian practitioners. This course will be taught by the creator of Rapid Gender Analysis. Successful completion of this course results in a professionally recognized certification.

This course is offered as a course in the thematic concentration Gender Studies, as well as a core course in the Master Human Rights and Humanitarian Action.

Profile

- To be a doctoral student (at least 2nd year - an enrollment certificate will be requested)
- OR**
- Hold a Master's degree with a working experience (payslips of your current employer will have to be provided)
 - To have a background in one of topics of the course (**gender studies, humanitarian action**)
 - To have a C1 level in English

Tasks

- To help the teacher with the communication with the student group
- To answer students' questions (mostly by e-mail or through the course.giegroup.org platform)
- To help the teacher with the organization of the exams and the grading of papers. Grading is paid separately at the end of the semester (the rate varies on the length of the paper from 4.51 to 6.86 € gross per copy)
- No specific need to be present to all the sessions.
- There is an exam period end of April and the corrected copies (at least the grades and comments) are required for Mid-May 2025.

The teachers will give you clear guidance on the grading criteria.

Students will send their papers through the course.giegroup.org platform you will have access to, **no need to be based in Paris**.

The payment will be done end of June or in July.
