Objective of the Course

The course serves as an introduction to the field of study on the European Union's (EU) foreign policy. Students will acquire fundamental knowledge including the EU's 'actorness' in the international system, the institutional design of EU foreign policy, and concrete examples of the EU's engagement in global affairs.



Summary

The EU has been a unique and dedicated actor in the international system. In the face of the development of world politics, the EU has responded and evolved accordingly. As a significant actor, the foreign policy of the EU attracts considerable attention under the current global geopolitical context.

The course will first examine the notion of the EU as an international actor. It will then explain the main actors and decision-making processes in EU foreign policy. The last part will touch upon the EU's contribution to global security and the EU's interactions with major world powers.
